We have all had our heroes as we grew up, but times of war seem to bring more of the stories to our attention.



Accounts of everyday, ordinary people, doing extraordinary things. I watched as a young man was awarded the nation's highest military decoration, the Medal of Honor, a soldier as humble as he was heroic, Staff Sergeant Salvatore A. Giunta, ". In October, 2007, Giunta, then 22-years-old, was leading an Army rifle team in Afghanistan's Korengal Valley. When an insurgent ambush divided his squad into two groups, the sergeant sprang into action under enemy fire. The two lead men were hit by enemy fire and knocked down instantly. When the third was struck in the helmet and fell to the ground, Sal charged headlong into the wall of bullets to pull him to safety behind what little cover there was. As he did, Giunta was hit twice by enemy fire. But he continued charging and firing. When he saw his close friend being dragged away by two insurgents, Giunta shot both, then tended to his friend's wounds until medics arrived. It had been as intense and violent a firefight as any soldier will experience. By the time it was finished, every member of First Platoon had shrapnel or a bullet hole in their gear. Five were wounded and two gave their lives. President Obama said the medal he presented was "A testament to Giunta's uncommon valor, to

the parents and the community in the central state of Iowa where he was raised, to the military that trained him and to the men and women who served by his side."

What is it that brings out the hero in any one of us. One of my favorite chapters in the Bible is Esther. Esther was an unlikely hero who risked her life, quite by accident when that crucial moment came that would show her true character. What and who had molded her to be the right person at the right place...at the right time.

Jesus asked his disciples...."But who do you say that I am...?" The answer to that question may make the difference between a hero who recognizes the crisis and moves to meet it and another who stands and watches in horror.
