When I arrived home I lit a candle. I found myself in awe of how much light it gave off. It seemed like such a small thing, and yet in the total darkness, it was bright, and cheery, warm and welcoming. I received a

letter the other day from Anthony Saint-Vil. Anthony lives in Haiti. At the time that we began supporting Anthony he was eight years old. Now as a man, Anthony was writing us a final letter. "Thank you for your love for me, your letters, and prayers that helped me grow. I benefited many things from the project: money to pay my studies, uniform and school supplies. Thank you for all you do for me and you'll continue to do for me. I pray God to bless you in all your activities." – I love you so much...Anthony. It was really such a small thing...that monthly tithing certainly would not change everything wrong in the world. But it had meant the world to Anthony. We live in a world that is full of uncertainty. I can stand frozen and overwhelmed by circumstances around me or I can light a candle...and that is all He requires of me...and you. Blessings! Cindy+

Treasures of the Trail.... (part 6)

A trip through the twelve villages of Washington County...

The town of Clifton, laid out in 1870 on the Central Branch Union Pacific Railroad, is located in Washington and Clay Counties. Located west of Hwy K-15 along Hwy K-9, Clifton was named after the surveyor who laid out the original town in Clay County in 1859. One of the curiosities about Clifton is that Parallel, the main street, divides the town (and neighboring “Vining”) between two counties. The south side of the street is in Clay County, the north side in Washington County. The Clifton Community Historical Museum is located in a 1877 Missouri Pacific depot and offers a taste of life in Clifton in yesteryear. Located one mile north and one mile west of Clifton on K-9 is the LCL Buffalo Ranch. One of the first ranchers in the state to own a buffalo herd, Lester Lawrence died in February 2005. Visitors are still welcome to stop at his beloved ranch. Lester’s second passion had been to collect horse-drawn and antique farm equipment. A tremendous collection is showcased in two sheds. Calling ahead will ensure that you can tour the ranch and exhibits. 785-455-8465; or 785-747-3707.
