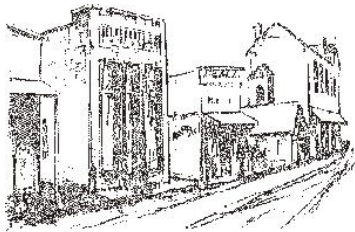

November 10, 2007 will mark the historic event of the Re-dedication of the Barnes State Bank building along Railroad Avenue in Barnes. The members of the Barnes Historic Trust along with the Nick, Mel, and Clint from "Little Blue Enterprises" have put many hours into the project. We love anything historical in Barnes, and the "Barnes Trust for Historical Preservation" is a not for profit Charitable Trust which exists to accept the responsibility of preservation, protection, restoration, and to facilitate education of the past, present, and future historical elements of the city of Barnes, including the community in and around Barnes. The first project originated with Clarence and Wilma Barker from Salem, Oregon who have contributed the funds for the restoration of the Barnes State Bank

building which was founded by his great grandfather in 1911. Clinton Hogue rode out on horseback in 1869. The story goes that when sunflowers reached the top of Hogue's stirrups he figured the soil was fertile enough and laid out a farm. Hogue was one of a group of Civil War veterans who came here with a dream. They homesteaded and then gathered in Barnes to establish businesses because they saw "A Need." The buildings that they built had tall ornate tin ceiling and thirteen foot tall windows. They built a community. Having come to a great respect for these men and for the heritage of this little community, the Barnes Trust for Historic Preservation was formed. Your membership and support for projects such as this restoration is encouraged. She will also have envelopes and Christmas stamps that you may purchase. She will be in the museum by the old mail sorter which actually was used there when the bank building served as a post office. The "Always Christmas Shoppe" which will be located in the building will also be open for your enjoyment. The ceremony for the Re-Dedication is Saturday, Nov 10 at 10:00am at the Barnes State Bank Museum on Railroad Avenue...See you there!
